Updates to the 2023 STAAR Report

- Beginning with the spring 2023 administration, STAAR was redesigned to align more closely with effective classroom instruction. TEA has released a [number of resources](#) on the new exam. Most importantly, you should know:
 - ❖ **New types of test questions:** New, non-multiple-choice question types are more like the kinds of questions teachers ask in class and give students more ways to show understanding. In addition to multiple choice questions, students now have short constructed response and extended constructed response questions.
 - ❖ **Evidence-based writing incorporated into reading language arts tests:** Combined reading and writing tests better support the interconnected way these subjects are taught and eliminate stand-alone writing tests for grades 4 and 7.
 - ❖ **Tests administered online:** Online testing supports all of the changes above and will provide faster test results to support accelerated learning. (The transition to online testing will be implemented beginning with the December 2022 administration.)
- The new redesign also led to scoring changes. Previously, each correctly-answered question was worth one point. Now, short constructed response questions are worth up to 2 points, and an extended constructed response question is worth up to 10 points. Additionally, students now have the opportunity to earn partial credit for an answer to the short constructed and extended constructed response questions. Open-ended questions worth 2 or more points now give students the opportunity to earn partial credit for an answer. As in previous years, each student earns a raw score equal to the number of points earned. That raw score is converted to a scaled score that takes into consideration the difficulty level of each question and is more easily compared across test years. The scaled score is what determines the student's ultimate performance (Does Not Meet Grade Level, Approaches Grade Level, Meets Grade Level, Masters Grade Level).
- The 2023 CEP Report contains the same information you saw in 2022 — individual school and summary results by council district as well as a comparison in achievement between Spring 2023 and Spring 2022. This year we have also added a new set of charts for each council district. The new pages graph % of students at the Meets Grade Level standard or above against % of students who are economically disadvantaged, with one data point for each school. Typically, we see achievement go down as economic disadvantage goes up. On each chart, we're highlighting what we call bright spots — schools who have beat the odds by performing above the city average while also serving a population of students that is more economically disadvantaged than the city as a whole.

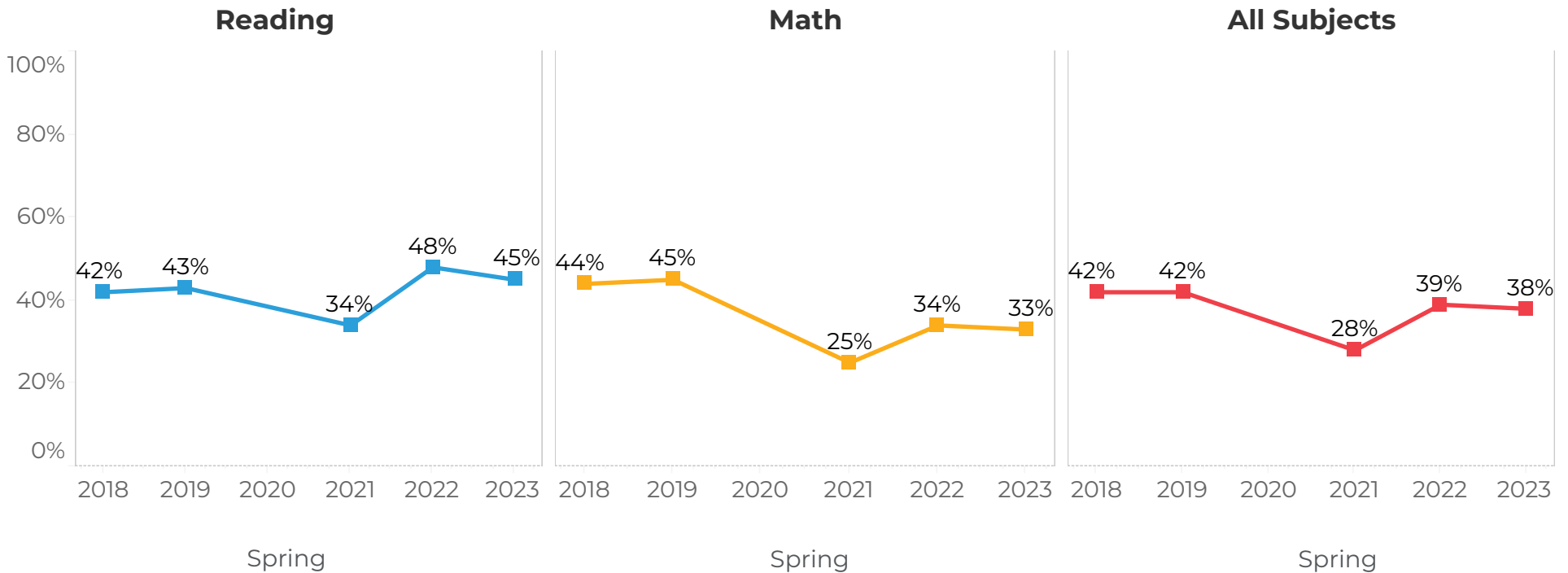

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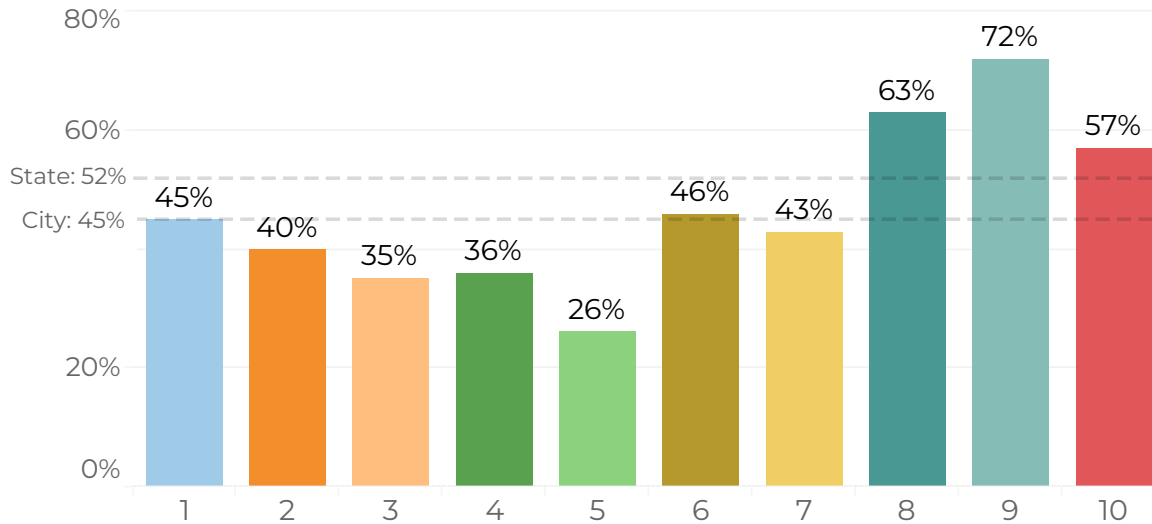

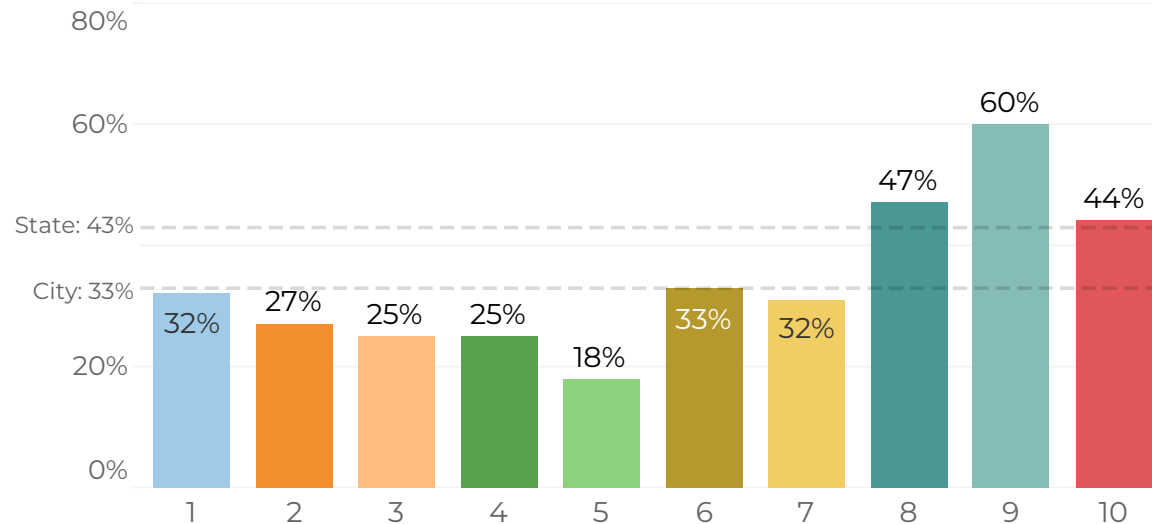

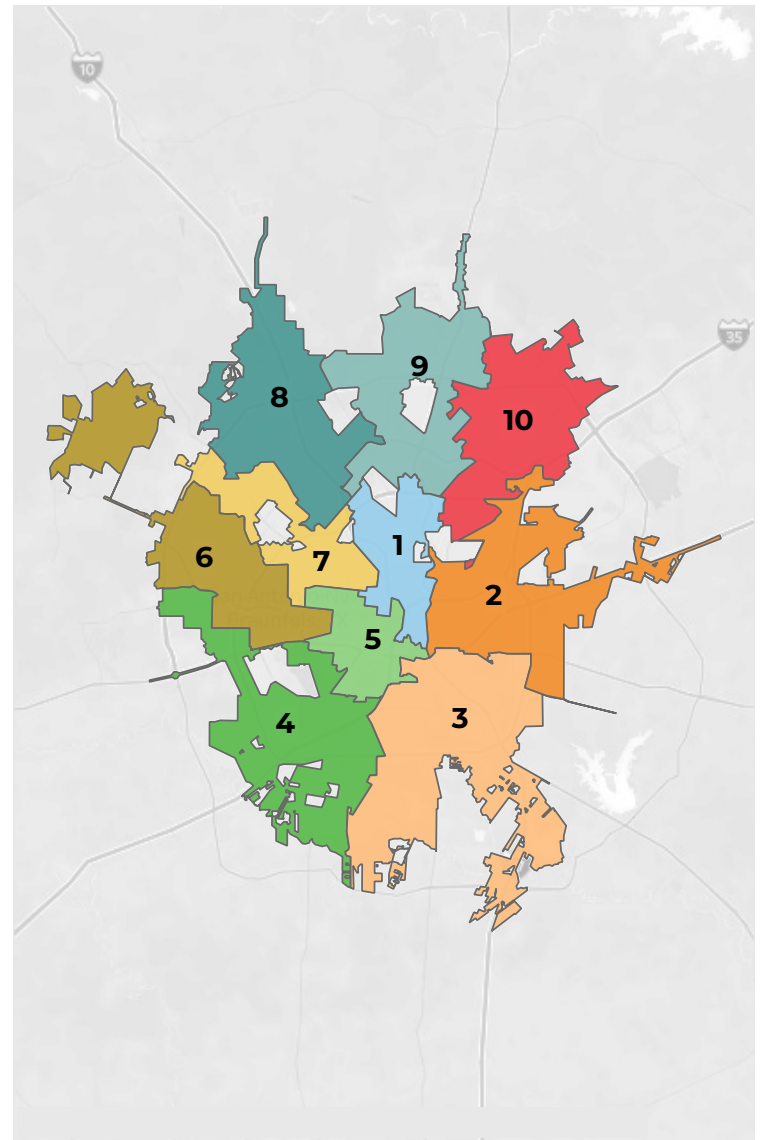
Reading Proficiency by City Council District

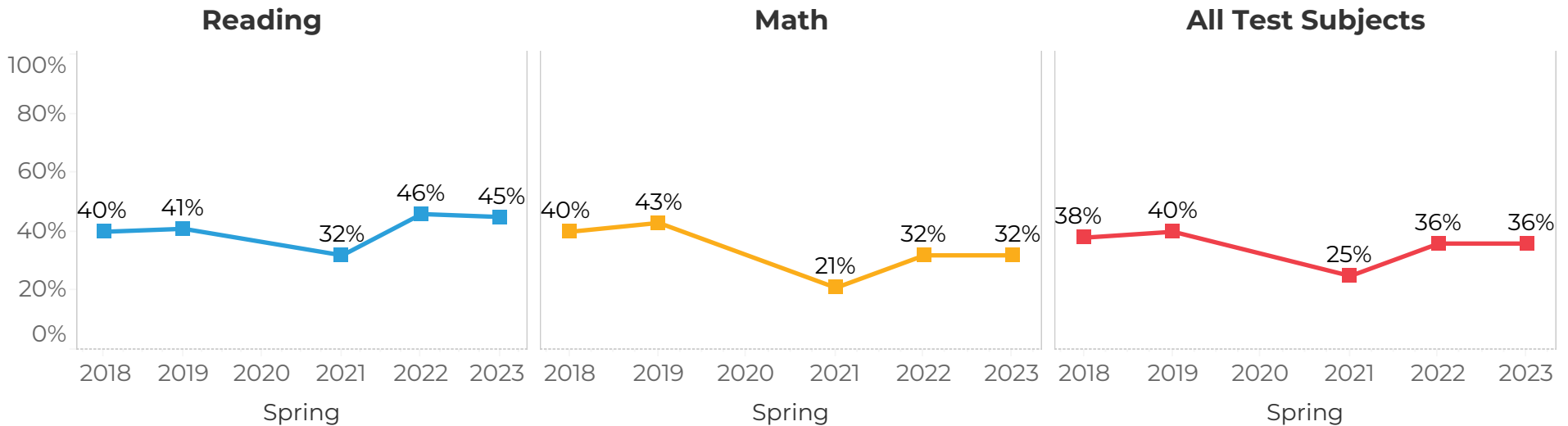

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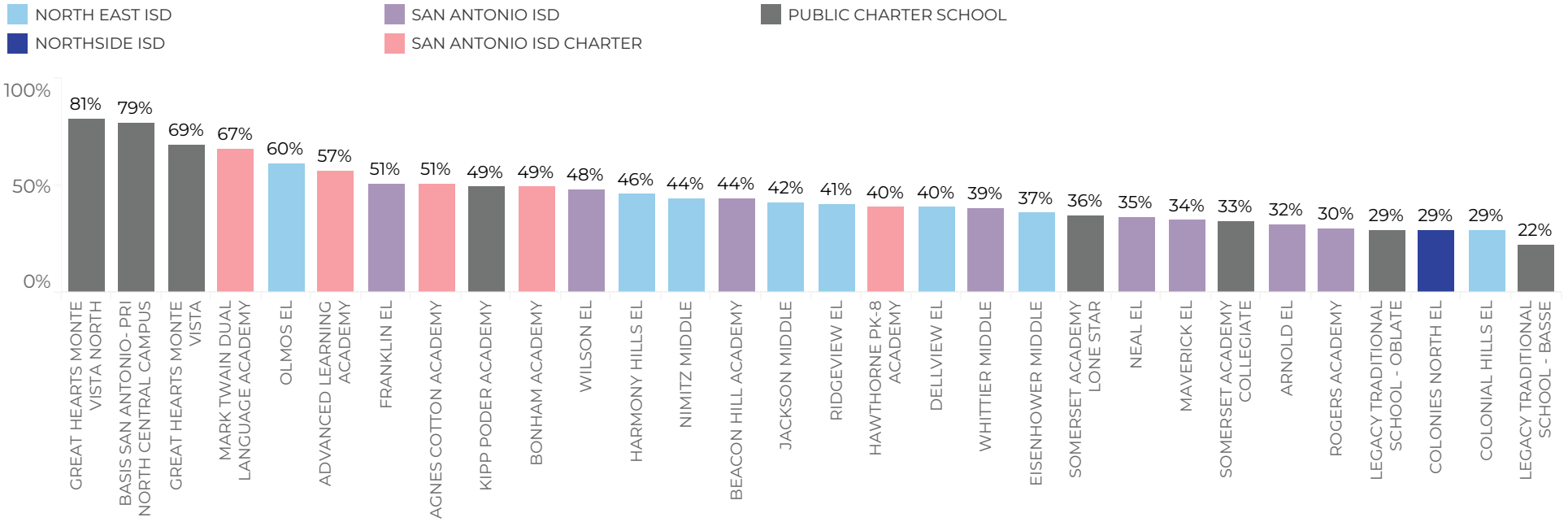

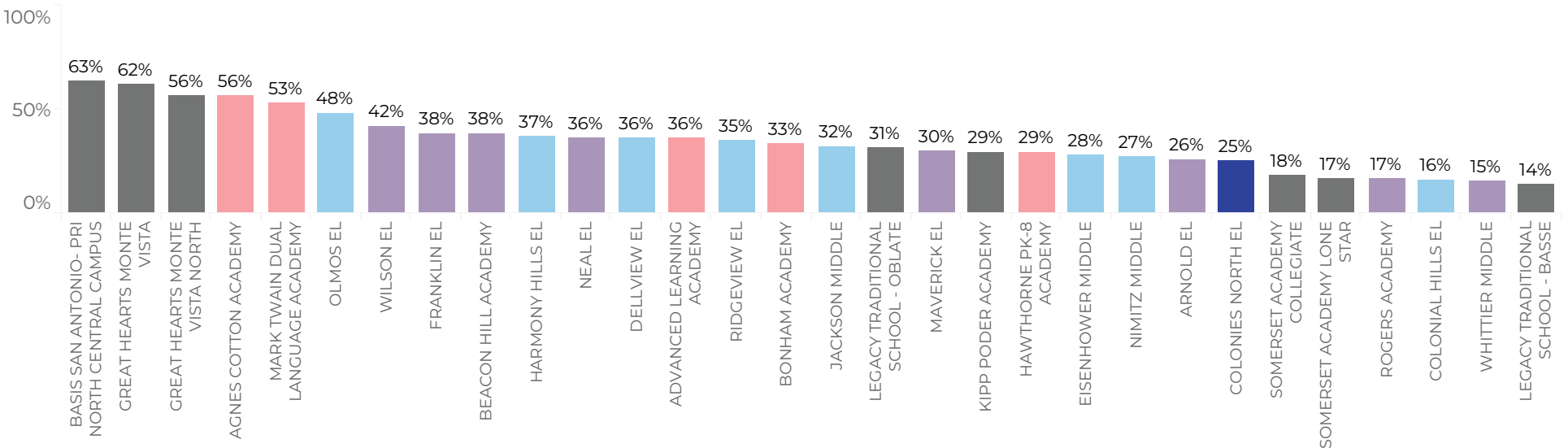


San Antonio City Council District 1

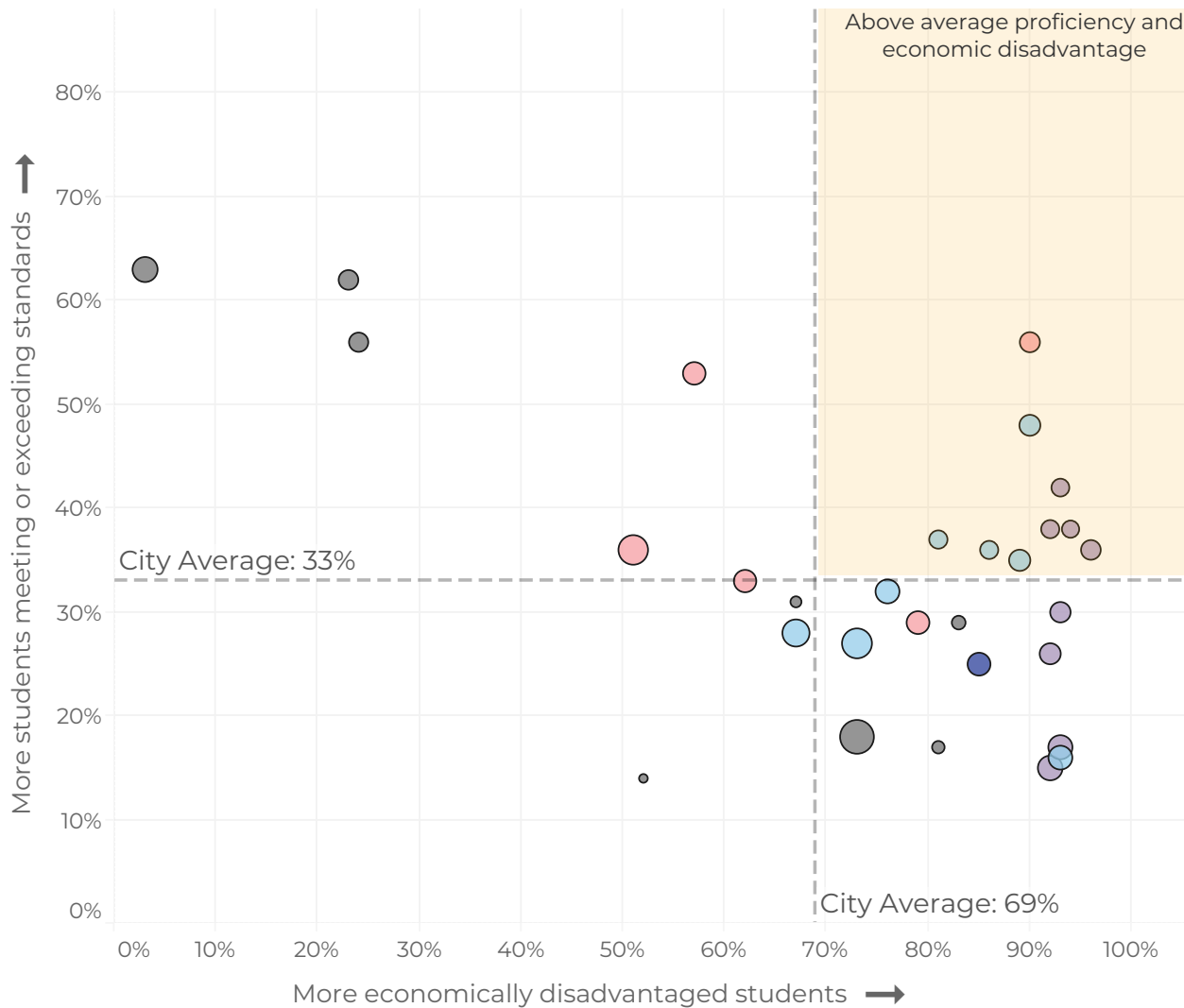

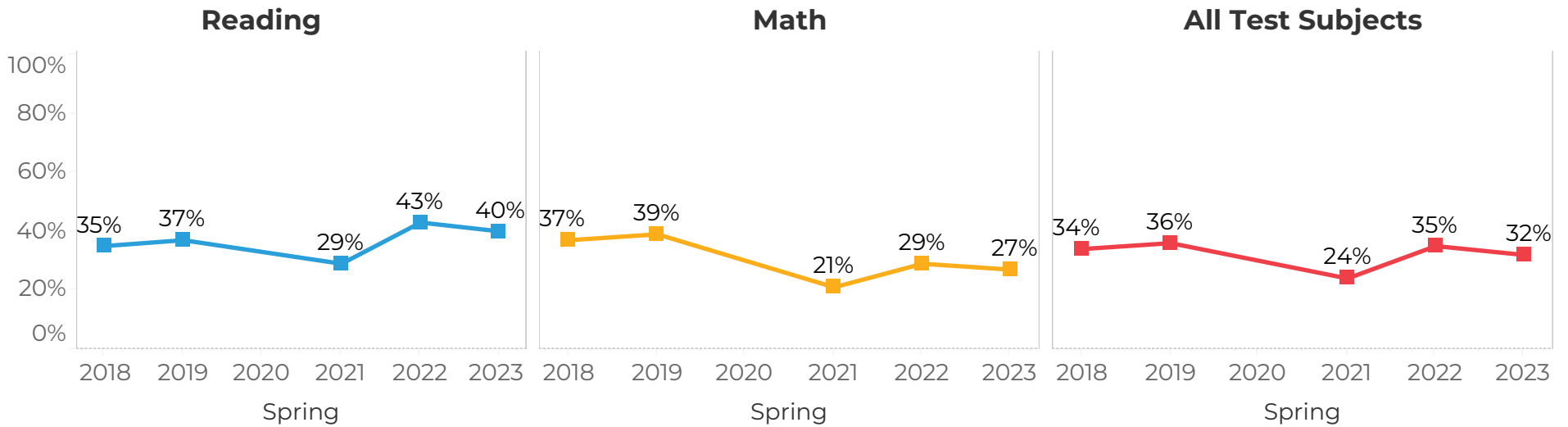

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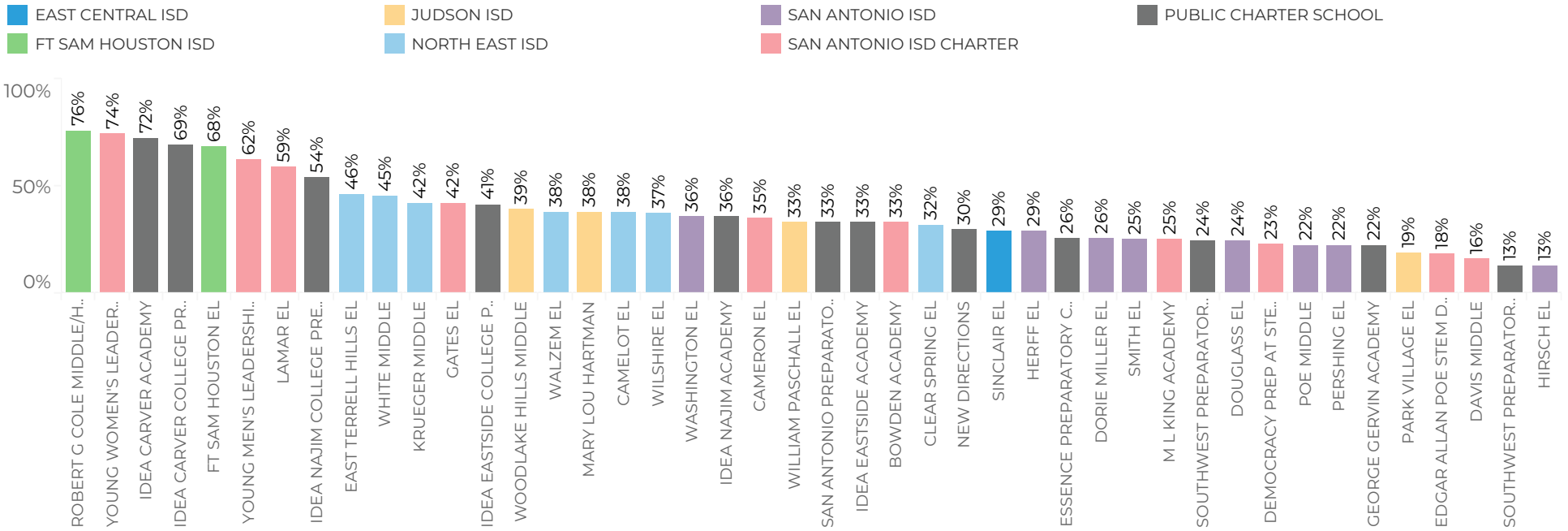

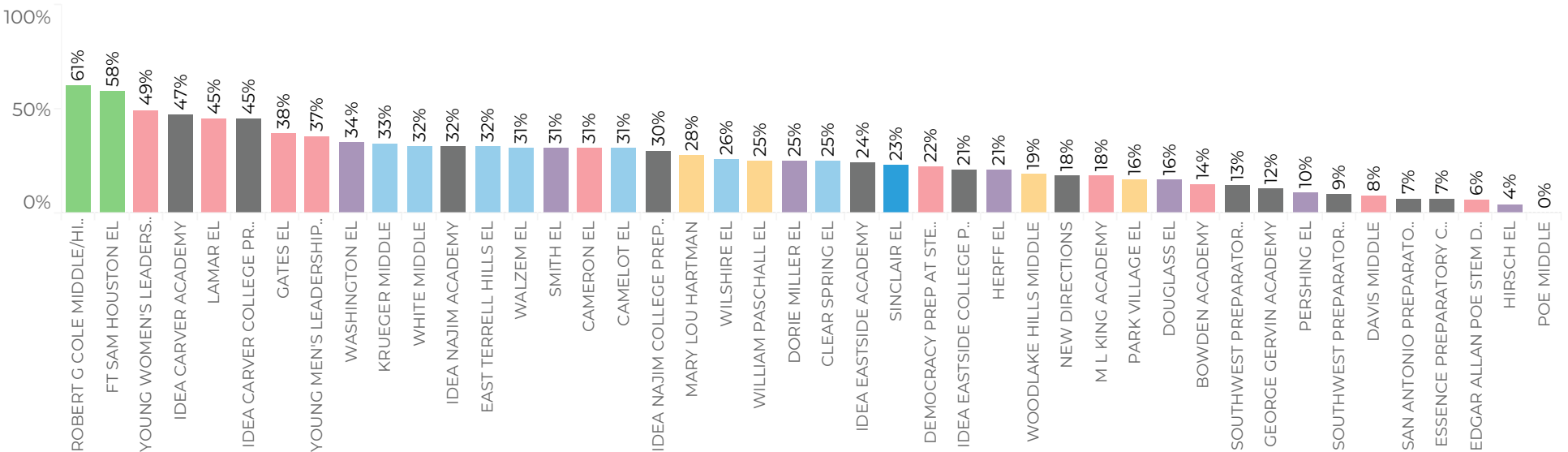


San Antonio City Council District 2

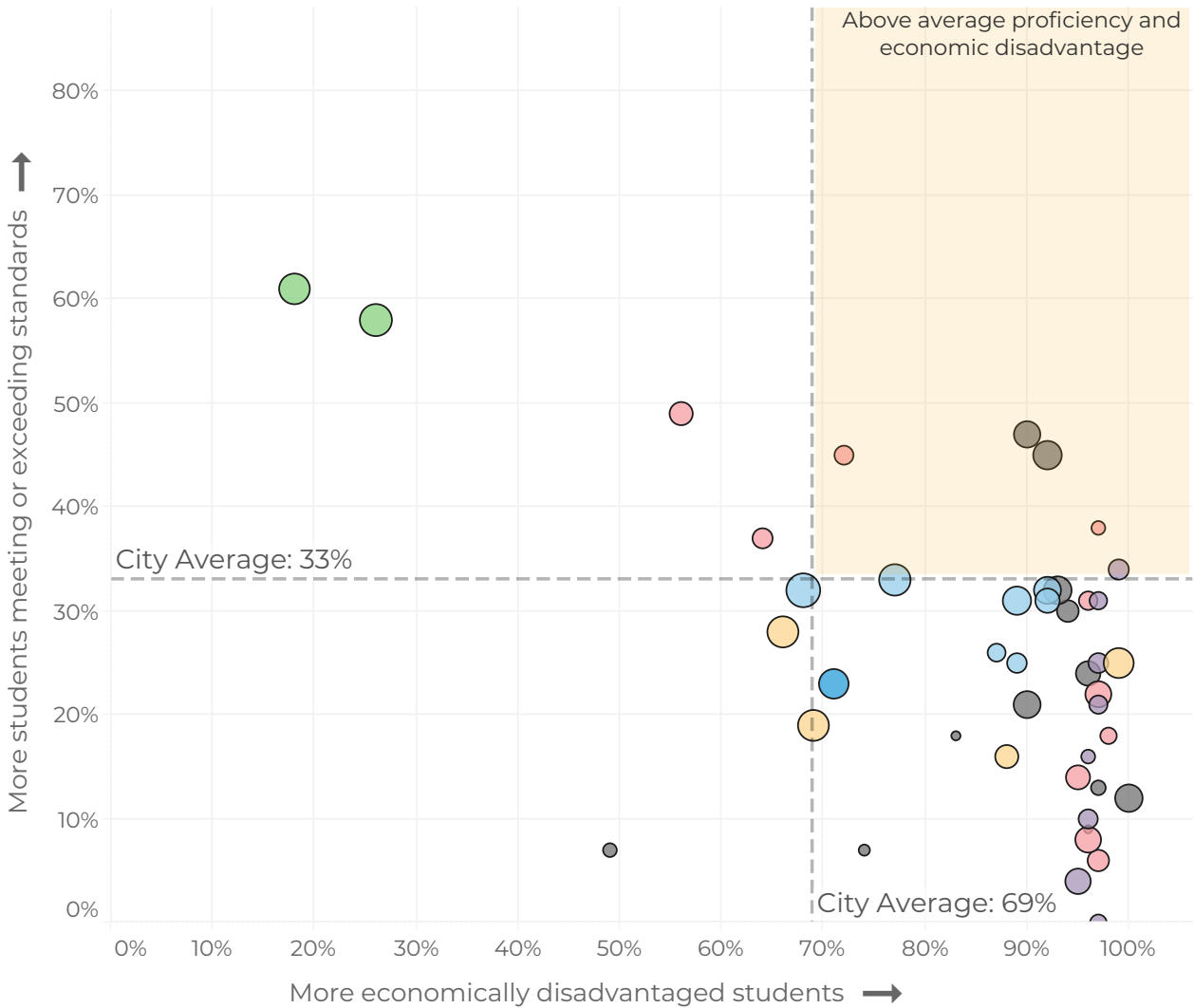

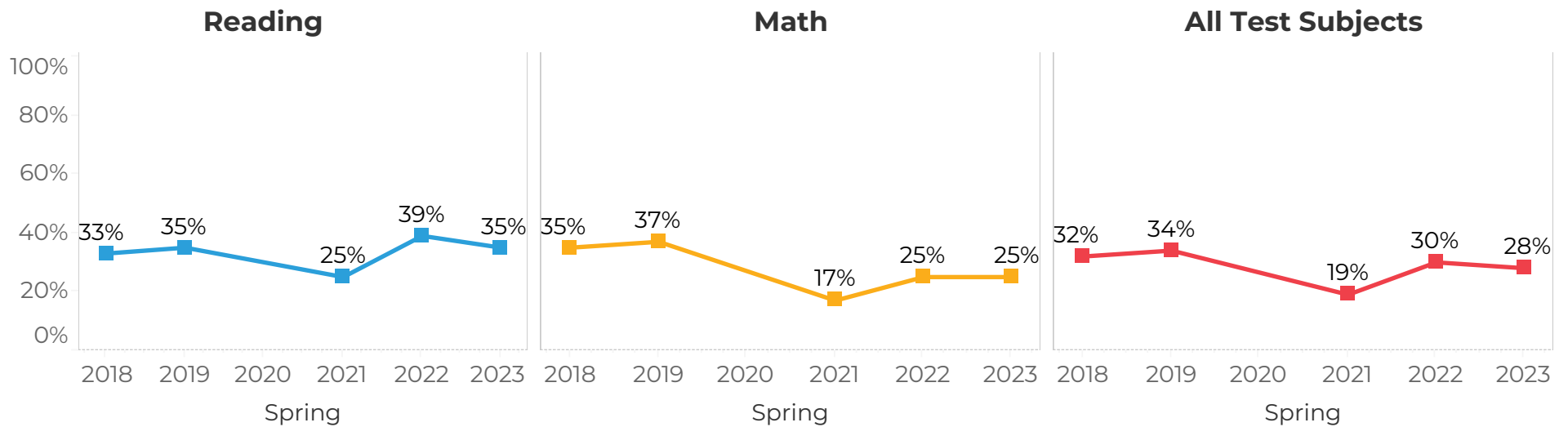

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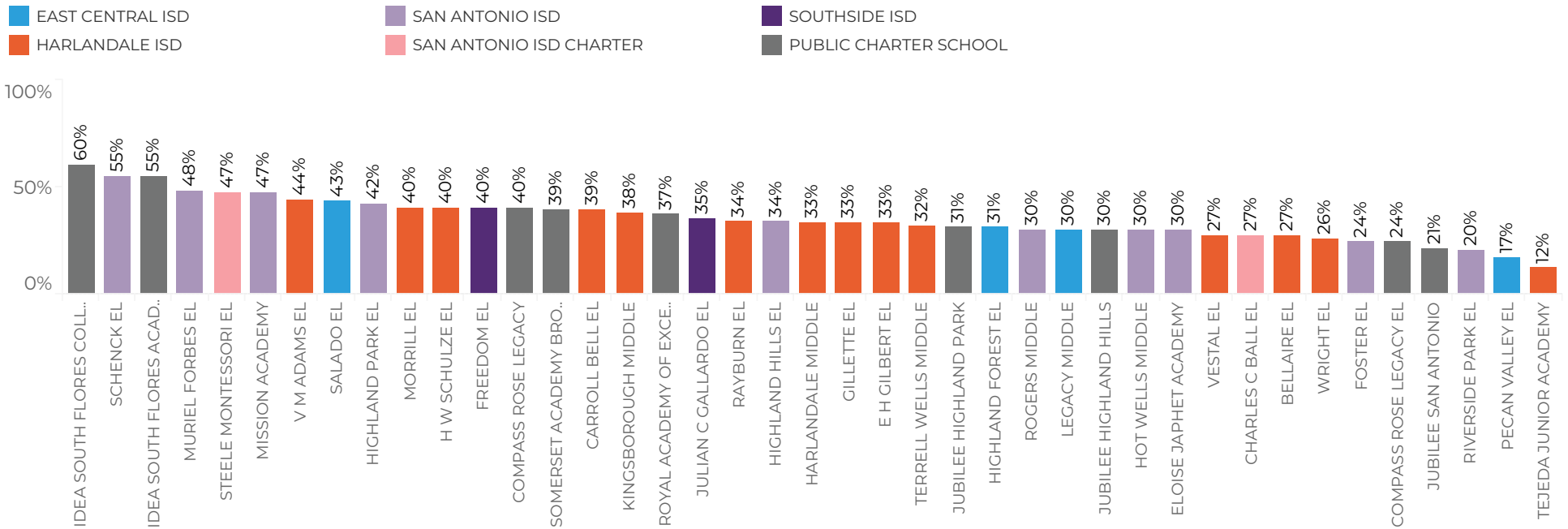

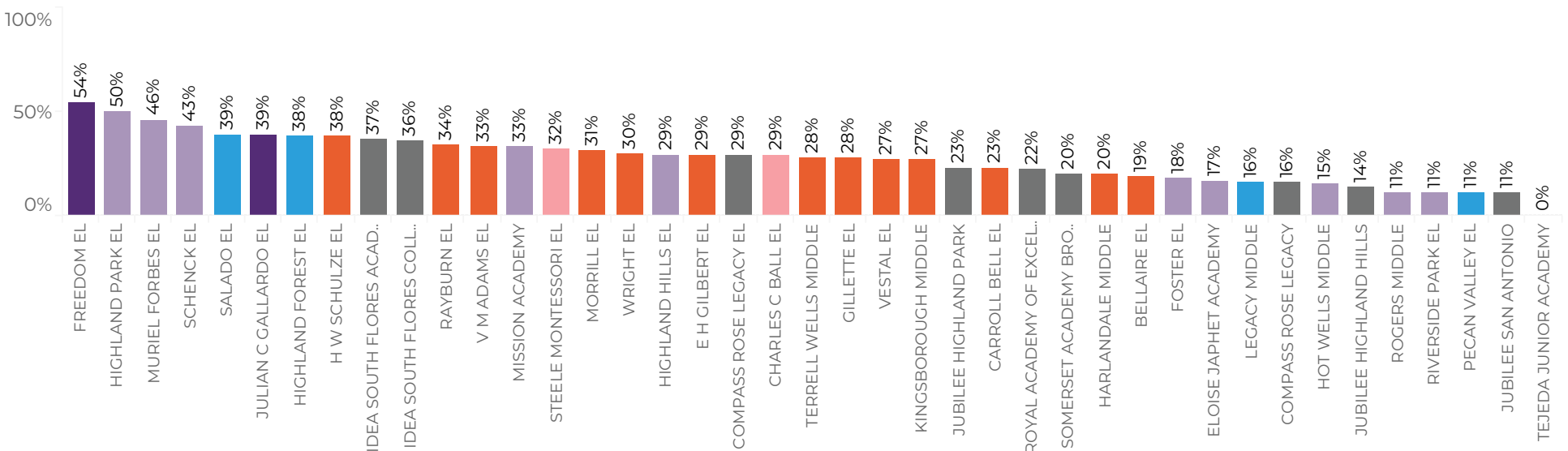


San Antonio City Council District 3

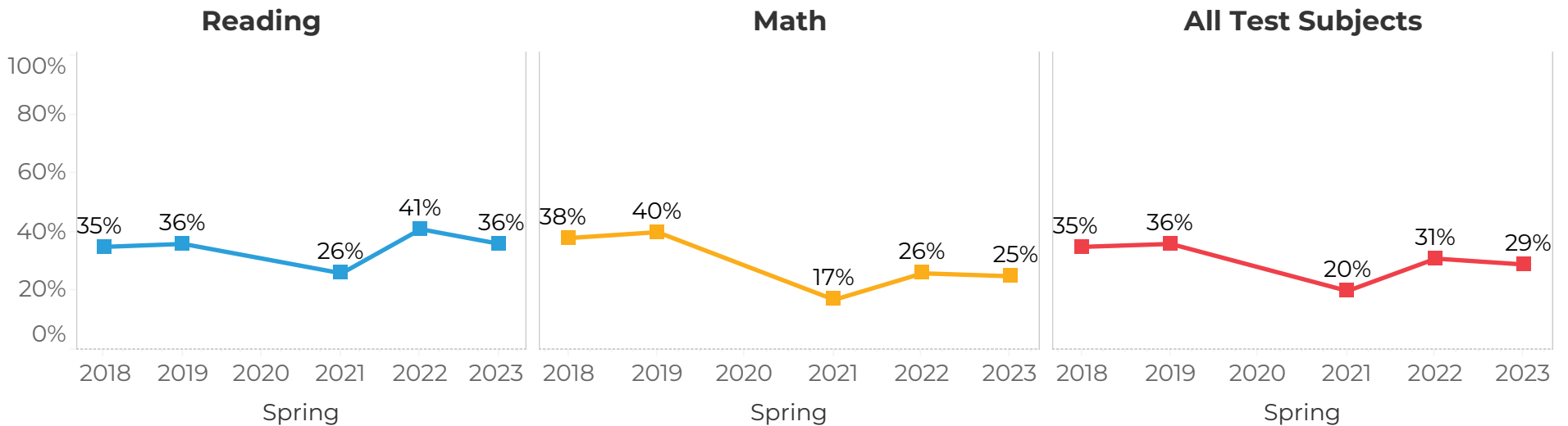

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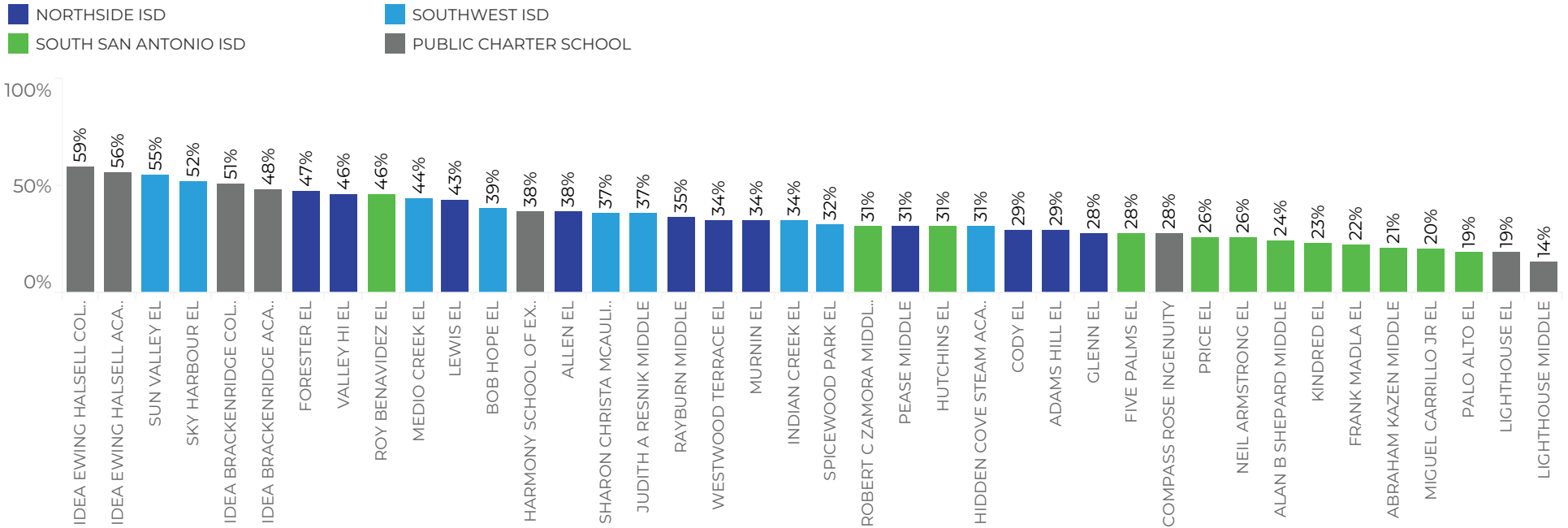

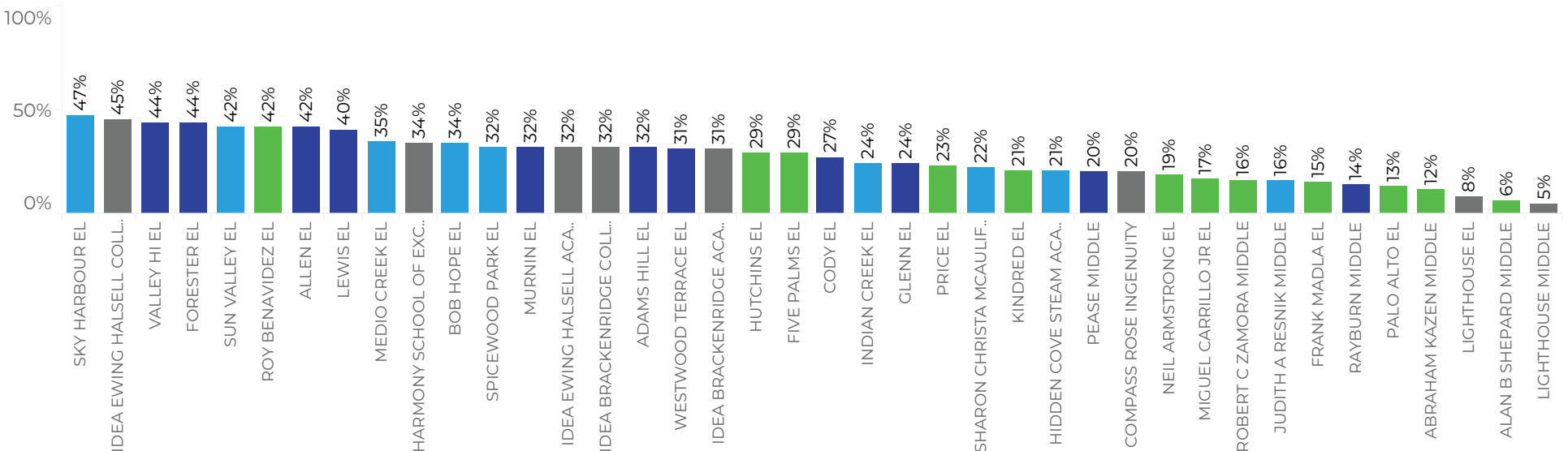


San Antonio City Council District 4

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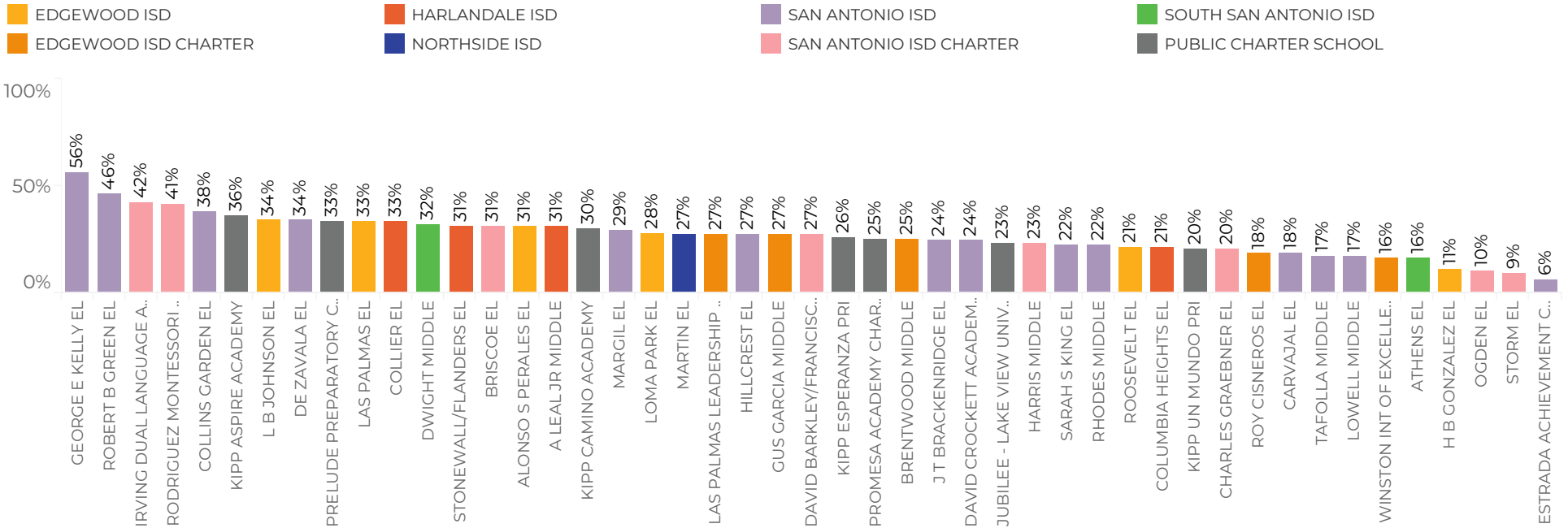

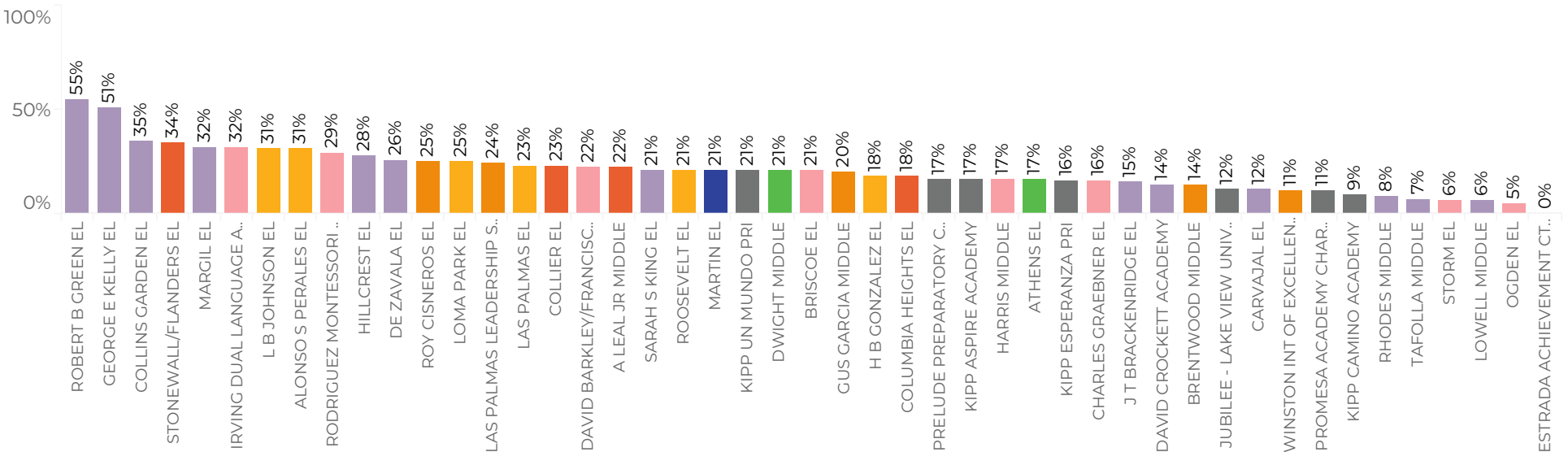

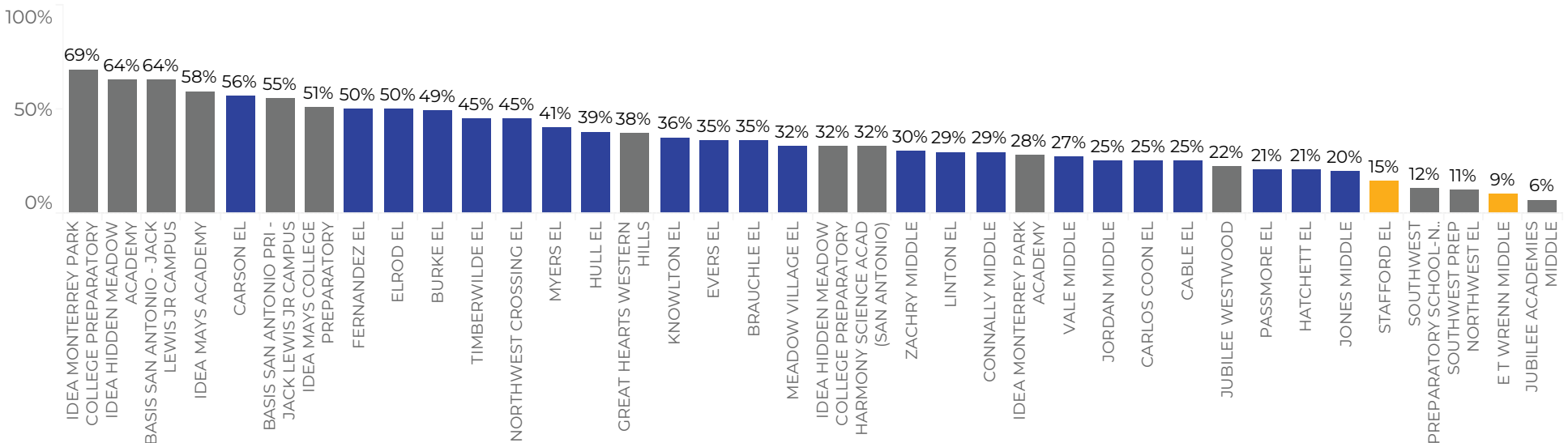

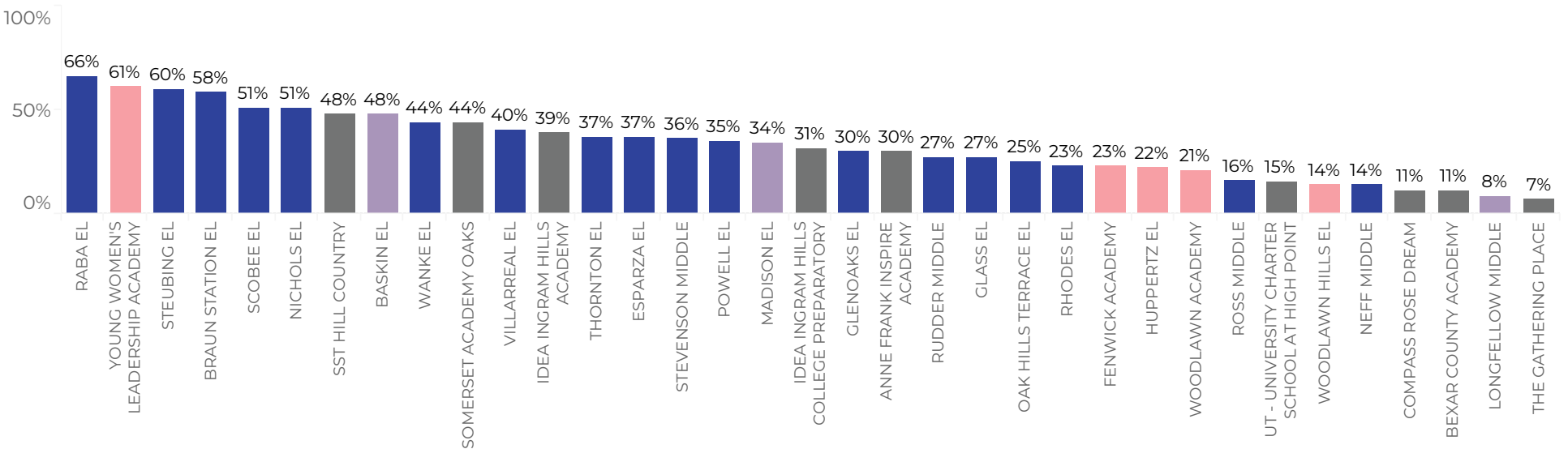

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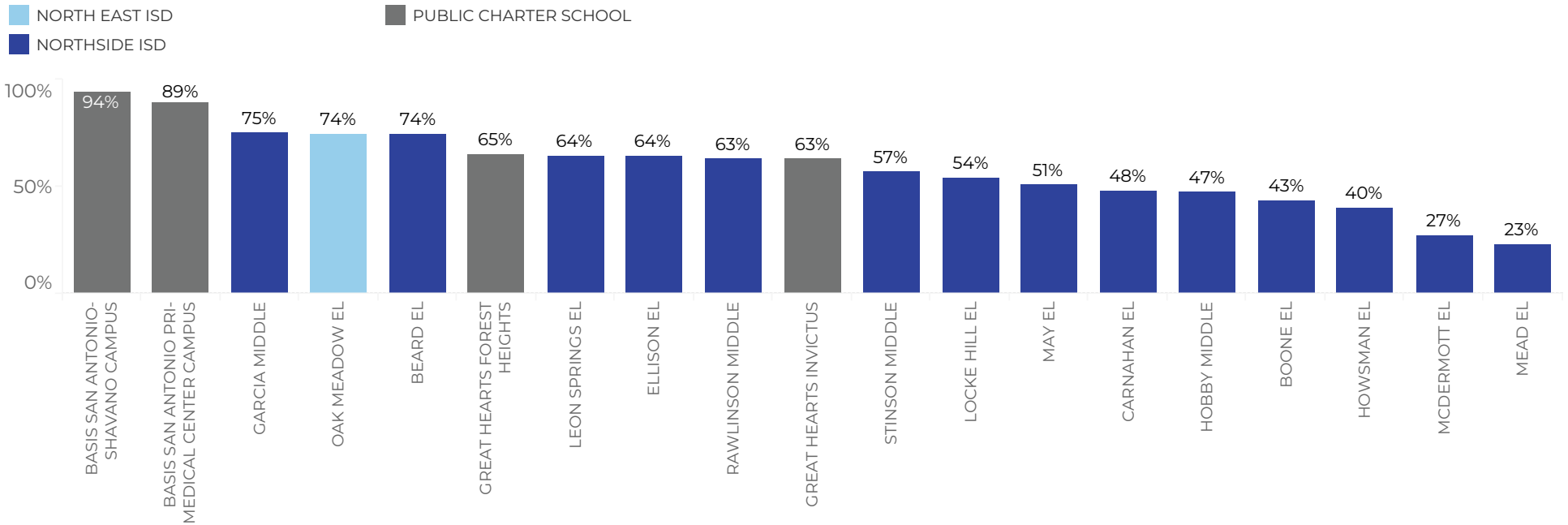

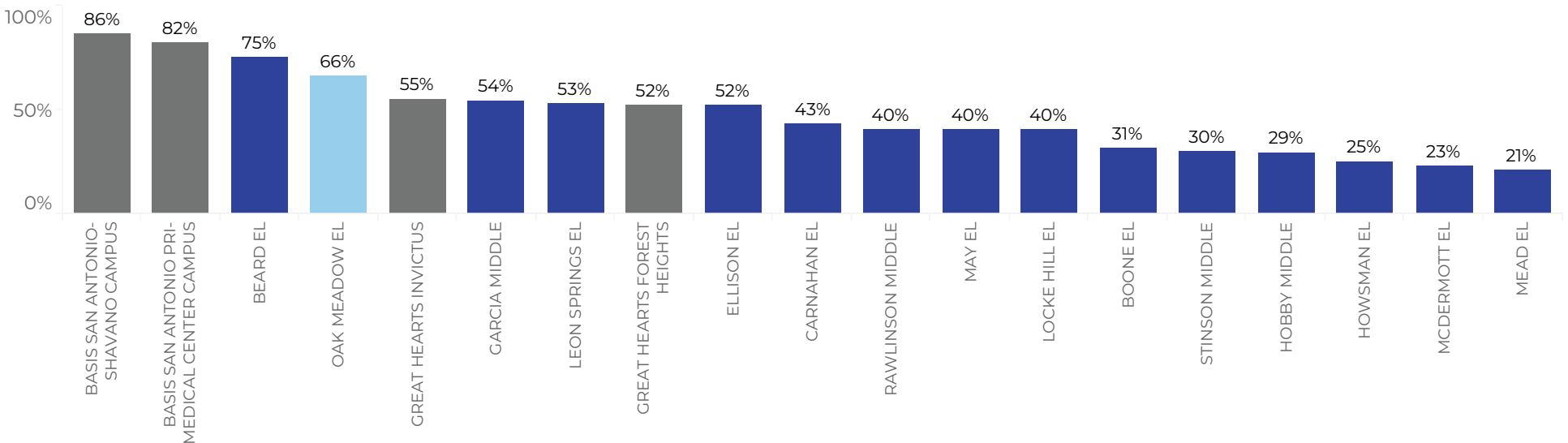

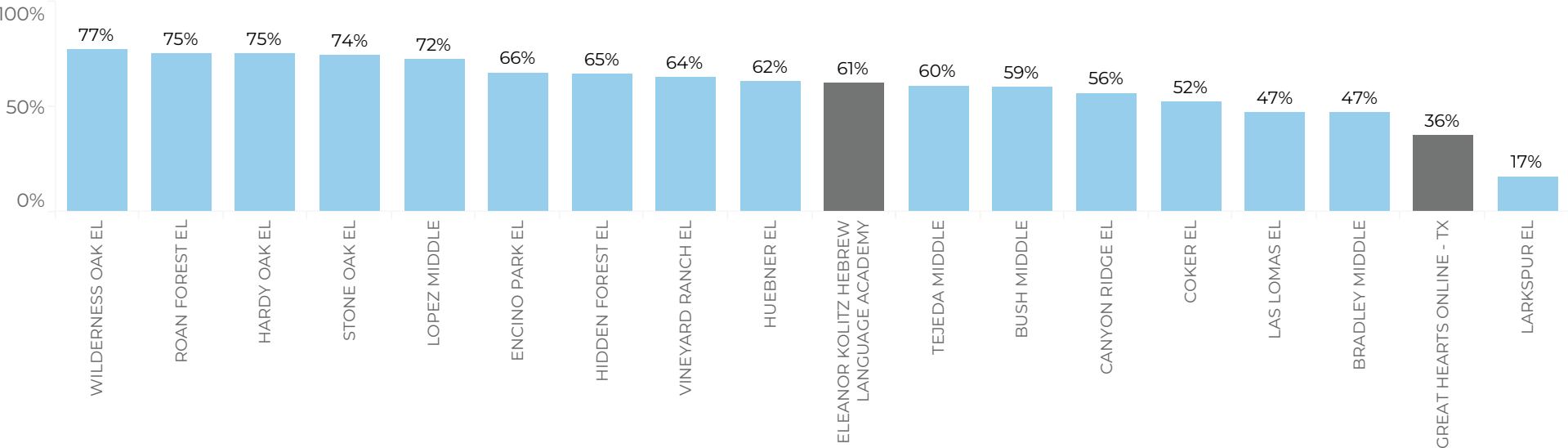

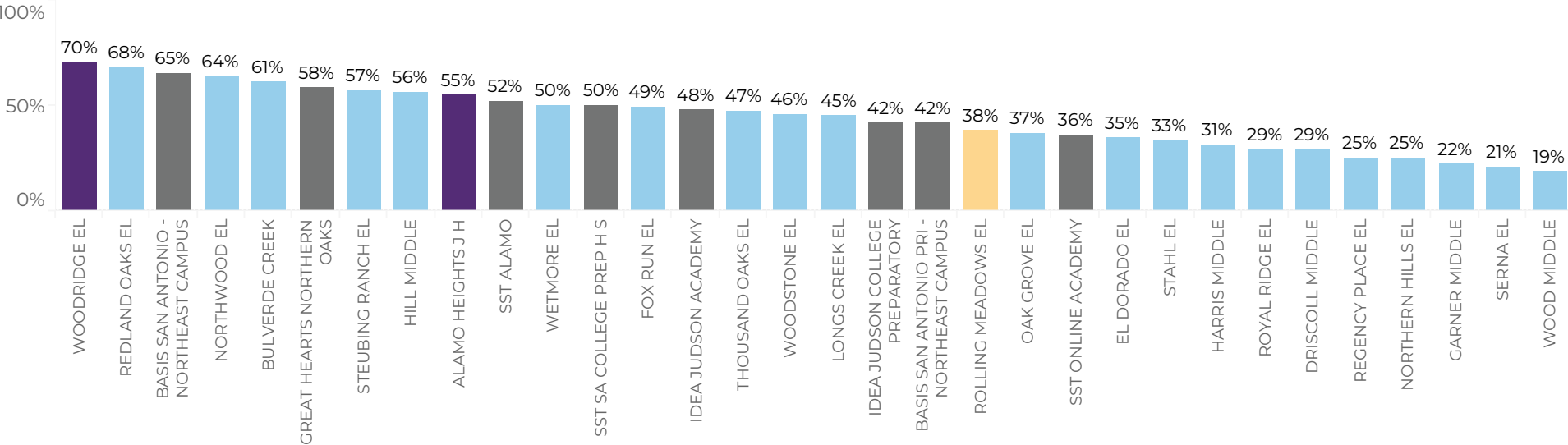

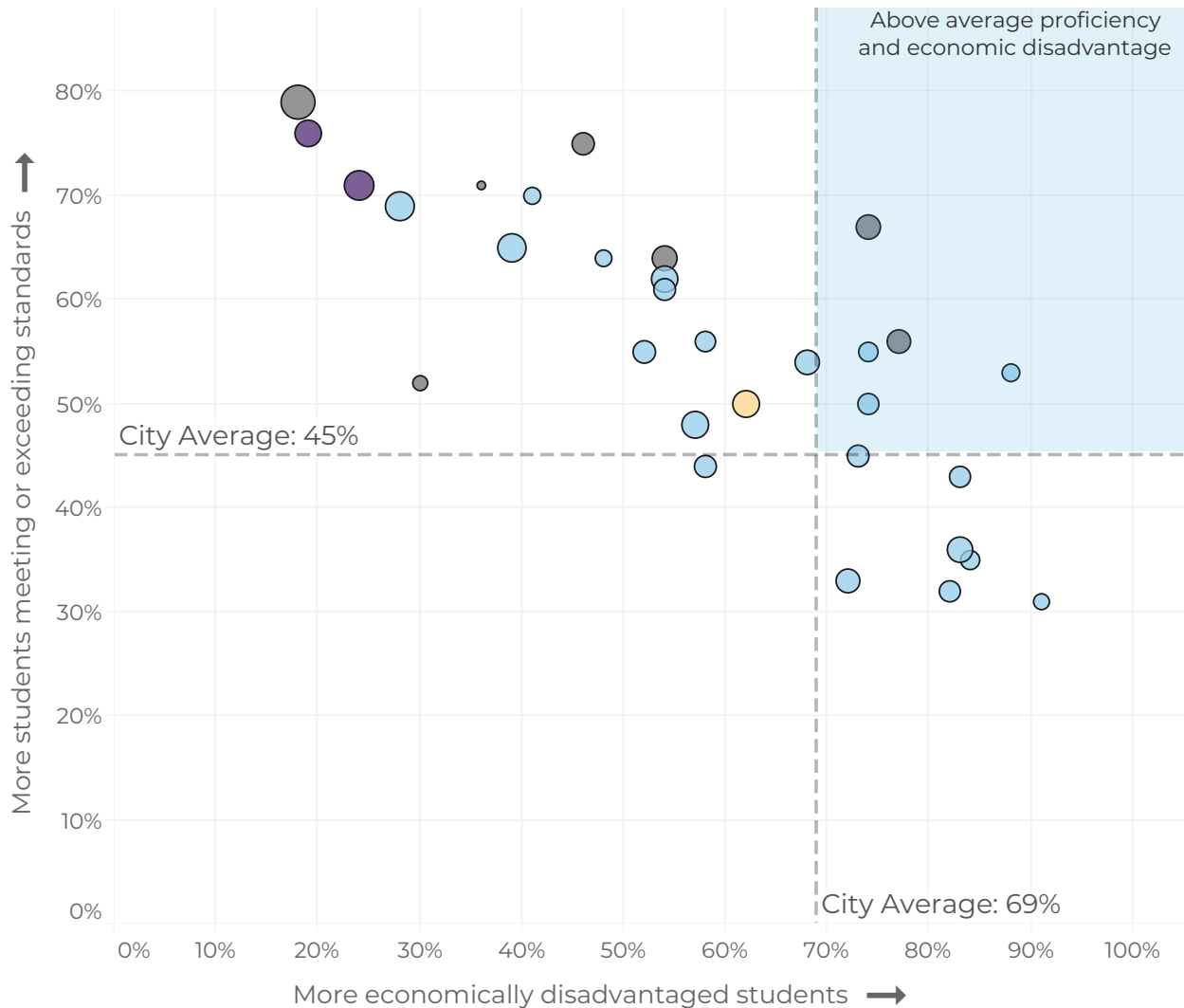

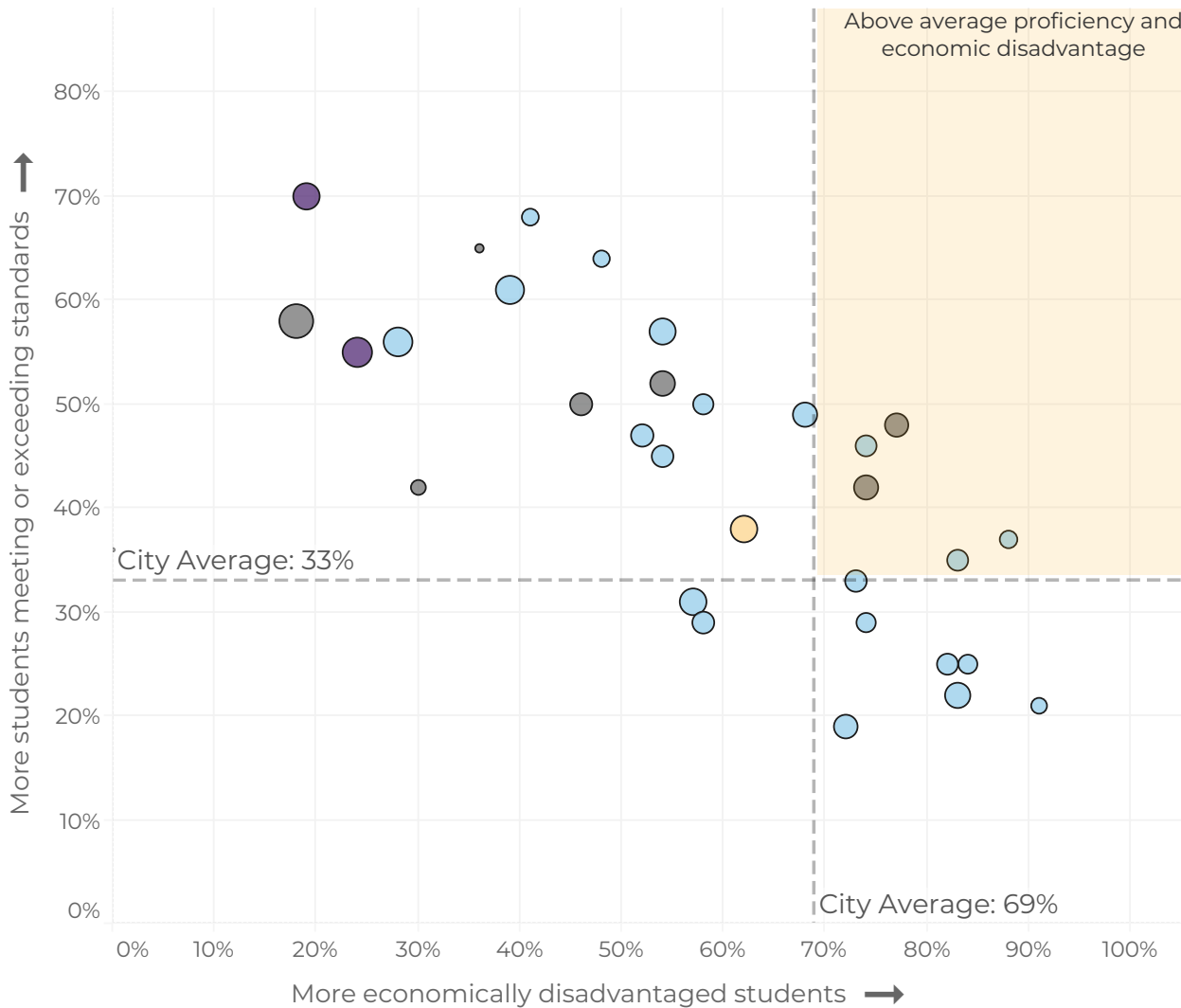

- All public schools open in School Year 2022-2023 and located within the geographic boundaries of the council district were included in enrollment counts regardless of grade levels or AEA designation.

Data Analysis

- STAAR and STAAR Spanish 3-8 raw data is from TEA’s texasassessment.gov portal, found at <https://txreports.emetric.net>. This released data is raw assessment data and is not comparable to accountability data tables or Texas Academic Performance Reports (TAPR) from TEA.
- School and Council District Data includes results from 3-8 STAAR subject exams (Reading, Math, Science and Social Studies). Results from STAAR 3-8 Alternate 2 exams or STAAR End of Course exams were not included in this analysis.
